# 21st Sunday of Ordinary Time

## A Warning against the Easy Road

As Jesus walks on his way to Jerusalem, someone asks him a question: "Lord, will only a few be saved ?

Jesus does not answer him directly. We often hear the opinion put in our day.

Something like: "Don't worry about hell. God is very good, so there is probably no one who misses getting to heaven.

Jesus himself seems to warn against such speculation. He seems to suggest to the speaker who asked the question, or such as you sometimes hear today - such speculation is unhelpful and misses the point. He says to each of us -

"Strive to enter through the narrow door!" In other words, don't worry about others - the Good News is addressed to you! -" You strive to enter by the narrow door." Do your very best to enter the Kingdom of heaven. In another place, we hear Jesus say -

"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14: 6)

We each must do our level best to respond to God's call. Do I live in a manner of Christ-like love and kindness to people? Do I try to live by the 10 Commandments? Do I share what I have also with those less fortunate? Do I have a lively faith in Christ – committing myself to Him and his redeeming Love ? Do I try to take part in the life of the Church, the community of those who follow Jesus?

Jesus says many will say: "Lord, open to us!... We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets." But Jesus says they will not be admitted.

In other words, just being <u>near</u> Jesus is not enough. Even coming to Mass is not enough. Being a card-carrying Catholic is not enough! We must allow Jesus to enter our heart and our mind, so we walk in a spirit of faith, hope and love. By believing in Him and following Jesus we have the best opportunity to enter the narrow door which is Jesus Himself. The Sacraments are all ways of meeting Jesus, so that we keep that faith and spirit of penance and love alive and active. In the sacraments, the Holy Spirit floods into our hearts to keep us close and IN Christ through his love.

God is abundant in his Love, and He invites everyone to enter the Kingdom, and to the Wedding Feast. Many from east and west, from north and south will come to the final Kingdom. But I have to continue to fix my eyes on Jesus and on his Blessed Mother, so that I too may share in God's Love and Glory in heaven.
