Newsletter No 04: 16 February 2020 Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time Year A

Today's passage from chapter 5 of Matthew's Gospel highlights our internal thoughts and desires and stresses their moral consequences for good and evil. Jesus clearly teaches us that sins are committed in the human mind if one has the definite intention of doing wrong even if the decision is not acted on. If we say we are Christians, we should not have this sort of in our mind and heart at all. Jesus taught his disciples and his listeners that if they entertain such thoughts in their hearts then they already commit the sin. Therefore, Jesus wants our hearts to be clean so that he can come in and reside in our inner most being.

As we all know, our heart is the temple of the Holy Spirit, where God resides and that's where all the good and great thoughts of helping and giving to our fellow human beings should be contemplated. To build up our relationships with our neighbour and our fellow human beings. Through our words and actions of being kind, merciful, compassionate, forgiving and loving. So that you and I can be called sons and daughters of the most hight. Jesus does not want us to contemplate any ill feelings or thoughts in our hearts because it creates animosity and enemies amongst us. Even if we do not act on our intention of harming others, Jesus already told us that we are in fact, are already harming them in our hearts. It is in our nature, in our being that we should take revenge, tooth for a tooth and eye for an eye. But Christ teaches us to do the exact opposite: forgive, forget, make peace and move on. Don't dwell on it or the past, but move forward. Even the slightest thought of revenge or harm in our heart is not good, because we actually committed the crime. Therefore let our hearts and mind be free so that we can worship God with a pure and clean heart.
