# Newsletter 09 Second Sunday of Easter 19 04 2020 Divine Mercy Sunday

My friends, you have been in self-imposed isolation for almost a month now. We have stayed in our bubbles because this is what our Prime Minister and her advisors have recommended for us to beat the Covid-19 epidemic. We have seen how 9 people have already lost their lives in New Zealand, and we have seen how thousands and tens of thousands of people have died of this sickness in other countries.

Perhaps we felt very like those apostles who cowered in their closed room on the first Easter weekend (John 20: 19 - 29). Jesus had been crucified by the Romans. He had been disowned by their own leaders, and they had fled in fear in case they too were apprehended. Fear too has kept us cosseted away from our friends and loved ones in case we catch this mysterious illness that can decimate good, normally healthy nations.

Jesus comes on this Sunday, as on every Sunday to proclaim:-

'Do not be afraid. Peace be with you." He comes into your home if you invite him, as you gather to remember him. Let our hearts also be filled with joy as the apostles were on that first Easter afternoon.

The apostles were hiding for fear of the Jews. They were no doubt still suffering from the shame that they had deserted their Lord when he needed them most. Only one (St John) had ventured to be at the foot of the Cross. Now as Jesus comes among them, he didn't scold them or reproach them for their lack of faith in him. He renewed his call and the mission he gave them:

"As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained."

Jesus comes to us at this time. He has conquered death and sin and even any virus that threatens us. We can rejoice that Jesus is ever with us. He sends us to be his missionaries of hope and peace into our world today.

May our faith in Jesus and in his Word be strengthened. We may still have to listen to the authorities to help protect people and each other, but fear should not keep us in its grip. The Love and Power of our Risen Lord casts out fear and shame and even our doubts. Christ has truly Risen and he gives freely us His Risen Joy and Life. Alleluia (Praise God!) is our song. He renews us with his Love. His Mercy has no end. Let us also show that mercy and forgiveness to one another.

Fr Jacob and myself pray for you each day. Please pray for us too.

# Sisters sacrifice daily Mass: 'We're all in this together'

Since the closure of churches in Australia on March 23, the Carmelite Sisters in Ormiston have forgone their daily Mass to be in solidarity with their fellow Catholics.

Prioress Sr Moira Kelly said the community of 15 sisters, including seven over the age of 80, and one visiting Carmelite, would not have a Mass in their chapel, the first time in their 93-year history, as long as Catholics were unable to frequent the sacraments.

It is a huge loss for the Carmelite community, who regard the Mass as the high point of their contemplative religious life and from where the Sisters find the strength to live their radical life of poverty, obedience and chastity.

Sr Moira said the Sisters were offered a priest to say daily Mass, but decided against it as it would pose a health risk for both the priest and their ageing sisters.

"But the main reason why the Sisters prefer not to is to be in solidarity with everybody else," Sr Moira said. "We're all in this together."


