Newsletter No 45: 29 November 2020 1st Sunday of Advent Year B

We are now into Advent, a time when the church asks us again to prepare for the coming of the Messiah into the world and into our own lives. Today is the first Sunday of Advent and as you all know it means "coming". In our Gospel today (Mk13:33-37), it speaks about watchfulness and preparation on our part.

Well, the Messiah was born 2000 plus years ago in the history of our salvation. It can never be repeated again. It is one of the events that happened for the salvation of all human beings, regardless of color, creed or nationality. Every year during Advent we are asked to wait for the coming of Jesus again at the end of time or when we might meet our Saviour at the end of our life's journey. We are asked to constantly be on our guard and be ready for that day to come. As the Gospel reminds us no one knows exactly what time of the day or the hour when we are going to face that ultimate decision.

So, whatever we do in our daily lives, we have to be conscious of the effects that it will have on ourselves and on other people around us. God created us to live in a community where we can have that connection and relationship with our fellow human beings. We are not an island where we can't interact with each other or trees or plants that stand in one particular place. We are created so that we can have a relationship and be responsible for our actions. Pope Paul VI said in his encyclical letter, "that today we don't need good teachers, what we need are witnessing teachers". Our lives are to be a witness to the Gospel values of love, mercy, compassion, forgiveness, generosity etc. As we go into the Advent Season let us remember that words are not enough to change one's heart. Actions speak louder than words, so let's put our words into action and make a difference in our family, community and society.
