31st Sunday of Ordinary Time Mission Sunday

This Sunday we celebrate Mission Sunday, an important day in the life of the Church when we reach out in solidarity and pray for all the Christian missions of the world. Jesus is our model for evangelisation. In the Gospel this Sunday, we see a remarkably friendly exchange between Jesus and the scribe, when Jesus is asked 'one commandment' that was first, he mentions two. This was the clearest way of saying that they cannot be separated. Between these two there is a bridge: there is no real love of God without love of neighbour, and no deep or lasting love of neighbour without love of God. In Irish a person who has lost one hand is said to be ar leath-lamh, "half-handed." As we thank God and celebrate our faith we are also invited to reflect on what it means to be a missionary in our everyday lives. As Christians we are all missionaries, for Christ gives us a responsibility through the Church to build the kingdom of God. When we experience the joy of knowing God and being loved by God we have a duty to share this joy with others. Evangelization happens in a whole lot of ways. We are familiar with the more public expressions of it - the celebration of the sacraments, the solemn novenas, the parish missions, the overseas missions, the activities of organized groups who work in family or youth ministry, the charitable organizations who do so much to relieve poverty and suffering and so on. Perhaps it is worth recalling that that we can evangelize in whatever circum-

stances we find ourselves – at home, at school, in the workplace, in our neighbourhoods, in our dealings with people. "Your gifts are manifold and your apostolate varied, yet all that you do is meant to advance the Church's mission by ensuring that all aspects of life are permeated and perfected by Christ's Spirit." (Pope Francis)
