The icon of Holy Mary, Mother of God – Ko Hata Maria, Te Matua Wahine o Te Atua

The icon of Holy Mary, Mother of God – Ko Hata Maria, Te Matua Wahine o Te Atua is continuing its year-long Hikoi through Aotearoa-New Zealand.

Our Parish of Our Lady Star of the Sea – Te Whetu o Te Moana is hosting it on Saturday 30 July through to Tuesday morning 2 August 2022.

Upon completion of the Hikoi in our Archdiocese it will be enshrined in Saint Mary of the Angels Church in Wellington on the Feast of the Assumption, 15 August 2022. The artwork is accompanied by Korty Wilson – Kaitiaki [guardian] a Kuia from Palmerston North, on behalf of the New Zealand Bishops.

Our timetable for Our Lady Star of the Sea is:

Saturday 30 July 2022 - 9.30am Mass followed by Morning Tea at Saint Mary's Blenheim

Saturday 30 July 2022 - 5pm Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion at Saint Mary's Blenheim

Sunday 31 July 2022 8am Seddon Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion; 9am Picton Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion.

10am Blenheim Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion.

The Icon will travel down to Kaikoura after the Saturday morning Mass and be formally welcomed with a Powhiri upon arrival at Takahanga Marae in Kaikoura. This marae is known as a Catholic marae and has a beautiful shrine to Our Lady as part of its magnificent Whare Nui – its meeting house.

Takahanga Marae is situated just off the Main Road South – State Highway 1 – on Takahanga Terrace

On Sunday 31 July 2022 Mass at 9.30am – Miha – will be celebrated and followed by a shared light meal. If you are planning to make this pilgrimage and, I am delighted that parishioners are doing so, we ask you to bring some food to share. The parish will also provide some food and make a koha [gift] to the marae on your behalf.

On Monday 1 August the icon will be stationed in the Mercy Chapel to allow school children from Saint Mary's School and pre-School to visit.
