four priority focus areas where action and energy will drive the thinking, decisions and action to bring about the future they want. They are Community, Ministry, Formation and Property & Finance. All of these areas are interdependent. The each involve action together as a Province, and action by the province in each of the four countries with their multitude of different cultures, standards of living, governments, spiritualities, social demographics and social issues. So much work has been done in the analysis, assessment, discernment, and planning for each of these areas.

In four sessions devoted to each area, they had an Over-all proposal for Action that presupposed all this previous work. The Proposals were decrees, instructing the incoming Provincial and Council to ensure the whole province was engaged in strategic action in each of the above areas. To relieve the stress of the days, the evening gave way to cheering on the State of Origin match.

Thursday was spent electing new Provincials and Consultants.

Friday dawned to be a time of relaxing and renewing friend-ships before returning to the respective parishes to live and work anew, in God's grace.

People need to walk together in harmony to build a more fraternal world, Pope Francis said yesterday, reflecting upon his recent trip to Romania. The May 31-June 2 trip showed the important need "to walk together, both for Christians" when it comes to faith and charity, and for residents of a nation, when it comes to civic engagement, he said during his weekly general audience in St Peter's Square.

As is customary, Pope Francis reviewed his trip to the predominantly Orthodox East European nation during his first general audience after the trip.

Yet he also used the audience to remind people to take part in the "One Minute for Peace" initiative on June 8. The day marks the fifth anniversary of the Pope's historic gathering at the Vatican with former Israeli president Shimon Peres, Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas and Orthodox Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew of Constantinople, and their "invocation for peace".

Every year since that meeting in 2014, the International Forum of Catholic Action has promoted "One Minute for Peace" every June 8 at 1 pm. The Pope said people of faith

are invited to pray for and people with no religious belief are invited to reflect on "a more fraternal world".

In his main audience talk reviewing his trip to Romania, the Pope noted his encounter with Romanian Orthodox Patriarch Daniel and the Permanent Synod of the Romanian Orthodox Church, where he reiterated "the desire of the Catholic Church to walk together in reconciled memory and toward full unity".

"This important ecumenical dimension of the trip culminated in the solemn prayer of the Our Father," showing that "unity does not eliminate legitimate diversity."

The Lord's Prayer represents the "common heritage of all baptised. No one can say 'my Father' and 'your Father.' No, 'our Father,'" he said.

The Pope recalled the many moments of prayer and celebration with the minority Catholic communities, including the beatification of seven bishop-martyrs of the Eastern-rite Romanian Catholic Church, who died during a fierce anti-religious campaign waged under the communist regime in Romania.

### **Cardinal Newman to be canonised in October**

The Vatican announced yesterday that Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman will be canonised on October 13 in Rome. Source: *CNA*.

During a consistory of cardinals yesterday, Pope Francis decreed that Cardinal Newman and four other blesseds will be canonised together in St Peter's Square.

Indian Sister Marian Thresia, founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family; Italian Sister Giuseppina Vannini; Brazilian Sister Dulce Lopes Pontes, and Marguerite

Bays, a Swiss consecrated virgin of the Third Order of St Francis, will also be canonised. Their canonisations will take place during the 2019 Special Synod of Bishops from the Pan-Amazonian region to be held at the Vatican on October 6-27.

John Henry Newman was a 19th-century theologian, poet, Catholic priest and cardinal. Originally an Anglican priest, he converted to Catholicism in 1845 and his writings are considered among some of the most important Churchwritings in recent centuries. Ordained a Catholic priest in 1847, he was made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879, alt-

hough he was not a bishop. His conversion to the Catholic faith was controversial in England, and resulted in him losing many friends, including his sister, who never spoke to him again.

The British cardinal founded the Oratory of St Philip Neri in England, and was particularly dedicated to education, founding two schools for boys. He died in Birmingham in 1890 at the age of 89.

In October, Cardinal Newman will become Britain's first new saint since the canonisation of St John Ogilvie in 1976.

The first miracle attributed to Newman's intercession involved the complete and inexplicable healing of a deacon from a disabling spinal condition.

His second miracle concerned the healing of a pregnant American woman. The woman prayed for the intercession of Cardinal Newman at the time of a life-threatening diagnosis, and her doctors have been unable to explain how or why she was able to suddenly recover.



# Pope names women to congregation for consecrated life

Pope Francis named six superiors of women's religious orders and a consecrated laywoman among the 23 new members of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

The July 8 nominations breaks with past tradition of including only cardinals, bishops, and the superior generals of several male religious communities. Previously, the members had all been men: cardinals, a few bishops and several priests who were superiors of large religious orders of men. The women named members by the pope are:

- Sister Kathleen Appler, the U.S.-born superior of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul;
- Sister Yvonne Reungoat, superior of the Salesian Sisters;

- Sister Francoise Massy, superior of the Franciscan Missionary Sisters of Mary;
- Sister Luigia Coccia, superior of the Comboni Sisters; Simona Brambilla, superior of the Consolata Missionary Sisters;
- Sister Rita Calvo Sanz, superior of the Company of Mary Our Lady; and
- Olga Krizova, general president of the Volunteers of Don Bosco, a group of consecrated laypeople.

This is not the first time that Pope Francis has appointed a women to a major Vatican congregation. In 2014 he nominated Sister Irma Luzia Premoli, superior general of the Comboni Missionaries, as a member of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. That was the first time a superior

general of a female institute was named a member of a congregation.

Brother Robert I. Schieler, the U.S.-born superior of the De La Salle Christian Brothers, also was named a full member of the congregation along with priests who are superiors general of the Jesuits, the Discalced Carmelites, the Augustinians, the Scalabrinians, the Capuchins and the abbot president of the Subiaco Cassinese Benedictine Congregation. The new members also included five bishops and four cardinals: Cardinals Angelo De Donatis, papal vicar for Rome; Kevin J. Farrell, prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life; Luis Ladaria Ferrer, prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith; and Ricardo Blazquez Perez of Valladolid, Spain.
