## Mary our Mother Star of the Sea

Dear friends,

Today we celebrate with great joy the Feast of Our Lady, Star of the Sea.

Mary has been our Patron and our Guide from the beginning of Catholic life in the area of Marlborough and Kaikoura.

I know that many of you know the old Catholic hymn – "Hail Queen of Heaven, the Ocean Star". This English hymn is credited with having been composed by Fr John Lingard, a Catholic priest and noted English historian (1771 -1851). Many of us learned this hymn in our former school days. It is loosely based on the old medieval Latin hymn "Ave Maris Stella" that is thought to come from the 8<sup>th</sup> Century.

"Hail Queen of Heav'n, the Ocean Star,

Guide of the Wand'rer here below;

Thrown on life's surge, we claim thy care,

Save us from peril and from woe.

Mother of Christ, star of the sea,

Pray for the wanderer, pray for me."

In the hymn, Mary is looked upon as a bright star to guide the pilgrim Christian and the barque of the Church through the dangers and difficulties of life. If Jesus is called the "Morning Star" (Easter liturgy), Mary is called Star of the sea – the sea being a symbol of life and our passage to eternity.

Let us often turn to Mary as our Mother and our Queen. She is a merciful and compassionate Mother. She is a bright star in our life to give our families guidance, consolation and support.

As we also celebrate this day as the Birthday of Mary, we honour her who is called the first and most perfect Christian – the mother of our Saviour. Mary does not take us away from Christ . . . . she always leads us to her Son. He is always there beside her, in her arms as she shows him to us, and in her heart which is modelled on him.

Mary, Queen of Heaven, Star of the Sea, pray for us.

The Parish Team and myself, we wish you every blessing on this our Parish Feast Day.
