Jesus Encourages Us in our Faith and in our Following of Him

The disciples had been following Jesus in his Missionary Work of teaching and healing as he went through the towns and villages of Galilee. Just before, Simon Peter had spoken for them all in stating that Jesus was the Christ – the Messiah. Jesus had assured them that there were difficult times ahead and that he would have to suffer much. They must have felt bewildered by what he said.

Now Jesus takes aside Peter, James and his brother John, and led them up a high mountain, perhaps Mt. Tabor. There his face and his clothes became full of light and they had a vision of the glory of Jesus as the Son of the eternal Father. They were filled with awe and fear as they heard the voice of God. But Jesus was not trying to make them afraid of him. He hoped to strengthen their faith in him – whom normally seemed so normal and ordinary. He was often tired and thirsty and sometimes disappointed when people did not respond well to him.

Jesus comes to us today in all humility. In the Eucharist, Jesus meets us as a friend.

Do we take him for granted? Let us treasure the time we have in meeting Christ in our assemblies for prayer or the Eucharist. "Where two or three are gathered in my name there am I among you." Let us listen attentively to Jesus when we heart his word spoken in the Liturgy of the Word. God the Father says "Listen to him."

'Pay attention to my Son. Build your lives on what he says and does among you.'

Let us then be united with him by faith, by prayer and by good works. In the Eucharist, this is the highpoint of our week. But we must then live out the coming week – journeying with Jesus in his humility.

St. Paul says: "Join with me in suffering for the Gospel." We too must accept that following Jesus will involve rejection, difficulty and suffering. But inside there is joy – Joy in knowing Jesus in an intimate way. He calls us to Peace.
