Jesus walks on water...

Jesus was walking on water in the sea of Galilee and his disciples thought they had seen a ghost and became fearful or frightened. But Peter recognized him as Jesus and he said," If it is you then let me come towards you". Jesus said, "yes, it is I, do come!" What happened between Peter and Jesus at this very point is a biggest leap of faith that Peter took. knowing too well that no one had ever walked on water before. Yet he asked Jesus if he would ask him to walk on water towards Jesus. Jesus' response was "Yes come across" and Peter got out of the boat and walked towards Jesus. As soon as he feels the force of the wind, he began to doubt his own ability to walk on water.

Christians spend lots of money to go to places that have significant meanings in their Christian lives. The moment they get there, some of those places hold a memorable or significant moment in their lives, a complete turnaround in their lives; others have no impact in their lives so that they wonder why they spent all those resources and got nothing out of it. It is like Peter, who jumped out of the boat confidently knowing that the Lord is there to help him, but starts doubting as soon as he is in the water whether he has done the right thing and the fear factor comes in. He began to sink and called out at the top of his voice, "Save me Lord!" Jesus gently reached out his hand towards Peter to help him out of the water.

Obviously if we have doubt in our own faith journey, we are allowed to call out to Jesus just like Peter, "Please help me Lord". His hand is always reaching out to us, we just have to have the courage to search and find out where His hand is and have to reach out so he can pull us out of misery. We need to have complete trust that we will come out on the other side better than we were before. We cannot turn to Jesus only when we need Him, just like Peter, and call out to him to save us. But even when things are going okay or right for us, family are great, work is good, income is better, God can take the back seat of our lives. We don't need God in our lives right now. Yes, very true, but he is still putting out His hand to catch us and rescue us. Do we still need God when things are going smoothly in our lives?

Cardinal Dew's Response to the Parish's Recommendations: Parish Communication <u>1 - 2 August 2020</u>

In February last year you may recall that Cardinal John Dew directed all parishes in our Archdiocese to complete a review of their churches and presbyteries. This was an outcome of the 2017 Archdiocesan Synod, and as a response to the call of Pope Francis for us to radically rethink who we are as a church, and to re-organise and direct our resources to mission. It was also driven by pressures experienced by the Archdiocese which need addressing: earthquake resilience issues, reduced number of priests, too many churches for our mass count, amalgamation, and the Synod outcomes.

A Review Group made up of members from the Parish Pastoral Council and the Finance and Property Committee worked on the recommendation for 6 months before it was submitted to the Cardinal. Additional submissions from the Renwick and Havelock communities were included in this. Since then Cardinal John has taken the time to study and reflect upon the proposals all parishes put forward for the future of their properties, and to seek input from his advisory bodies; namely, the Council of Priests, the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council and the Board of Administration.

Cardinal John agreed with most of what the parish proposed, but after consultation and taking what he believes to be a pastoral approach, there are some differences. His response to our parish's proposals is as follows:

- Retain Blenheim church, presbytery, hall, administration block, community centre and Mercy Room.
- Retain Kaikoura church, hall, presbytery, and Shepherd's Hut.
- Retain Seddon church, and sell the adjacent land.
- Sell the Renwick and Havelock churches and land.
- In Picton build a multi-purpose centre on the school land with a base for Catholic Social Services and other mission purposes, and with a worship space of a chapel rather than a church.
- Sell the Picton presbytery if its land is not needed for a multipurpose centre.
- He is in favour of gifting or selling the Ward church land to the community trust, however more work needs to be done from a legal and financial perspective to enable this to be a reality, and this will be done as quickly as possible.

The Cardinal recognises that there will be difficulties and opportunities as decisions begin to be translated into action. We should not consider his response to the parish's proposals to be a "final decision", but rather we should recognise the considered response relative to his own consultation with his advisory bodies, as previously described, and reflect on it seriously as we plan for the future.

We acknowledge that a sense of loss and anger for all of us at the thought of some of our mass centres closing is inevitable, and we will endeavour to confirm the timeframes for these as soon as possible. Understanding how to best meet the future pastoral needs of these areas after the closure of the Mass centres will be an important step in the process.

At St Mary's, we have the additional consideration of the church's Heritage 1 rating, but also the need for earthquake strengthening to the building. Since we submitted our proposal to the Cardinal, we have received a report from a conservation architect whom we engaged last year. The recommendations from this will also need to be factored into the parish plan and will be the cornerstone of future consultations for this site.

The Cardinal's response differs most from our original proposal in Picton, and further consultation and enquiry will be required to understand how best to meet our future needs in this community.

In summary, the Review Group, which includes Fr Giltus, as well as the Stewardship Groups have much work to do creating this plan. Timeframes are not known at this point; however, we must move steadily forward step by step to meet the future mission of the church. To that end, we will not be re-visiting our original proposal, but rather using this as a starting point, in line with the Cardinal's response, for formulating this plan. We will continue to keep you updated on progress as we move forward.

Please continue to keep the parish in your prayers, particularly those communities who face an uncertain future because of this announcement.
