Wisdom of Heart

"Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

This parable (Matt. 25: 1-13) is one of a group that Matthew places near the end of the ministry of Jesus. Jesus warns his disciples that he will come again in glory like the bridegroom at a wedding. What response will we show? Will we be wise – spiritually awake at his coming, or will we be like the foolish bridesmaids who were unprepared, and were shut out from the wedding feast.

The difference between the bridesmaids who were prepared and those who were left napping is that the fortunate girls were wise – they were spiritually wise and had brought enough oil for their lamps, whereas the five foolish bridesmaids were excitedly talking too much and did not take time and trouble to prepare for the feast to bring oil for their lamps. Their minds were on other unimportant things.

To my mind Jesus is calling us to have wisdom of heart that comes from an active faith. Five bridesmaids were looking forward with a ready faith, a firm hope and a generous love to meet the bridegroom. They believed in their heart that he would come and they took active measures to prepare to meet him.

The other five did not think ahead, and had become so immersed in other things that they were spiritually asleep – not thinking with any spirit of faith about the one who was coming.

Do I live my life with wisdom of heart taking time to pray, to ponder the Word of God in scripture, to be busy with an active generous love, or am I so immersed in daily affairs that I have forgotten why I am here, to welcome the Lord who is coming?

Jesus urges us: "Stay awake! True you need your physical sleep, but let your hearts be spiritually awake – to watch for my Coming."

Do I help my children and grandchildren to have wisdom of heart to look out for the Lord in their lives? Lord, give us the wisdom of heart to make our hearts active with a lively faith, a firm hope and a generous love so that we can go out with our lamps lit ready to welcome your Coming.



Letter from Family Life International

Preliminary results of the End of Life Choice Act referendum are disheartening. With <u>65.2% voting for the Act</u> to come into force, we have to wonder what has become of our nation.

Despite this being the expected result, the reality is still shocking.

Do New Zealander's really know what they have voted for? Do they really understand the implications of this decision? I don't think they do. Wesley J. Smith, a lawyer who works tirelessly to expose the dangers of euthanasia has said the following about the ever-widening criteria for euthanasia. "Once a society accepts the noxious notion that killing is an acceptable answer to human suffering, the definition of "suffering" never stops expanding."

Already, there are people commenting on social media, disappointed that the law does not allow for those suffering from dementia to end their lives. It will not be long before these dissatisfied comments become full-blown requests to expand the law.

Our response must be to continue teaching the truth about the dignity of the human person and the real meaning of suffering. We need to uphold the values we as a society have always held even in the face of great opposition. We need to preach the Gospel of Life both with our words and in how we live our lives.

Just as we are there in the greatest hour of need for the pregnant mother who believes her only choice is abortion, so too must we be there for the person suffering who believes that their only option is to prematurely end their life. It is only natural that a society that has accepted and justifies the killing of tiny human beings in their mother's wombs would also eventually come to embrace euthanasia.

The great Apostle of Life, Father Paul Marx clearly saw the relationship not only between abortion and euthanasia but between contraception, abortion, and euthanasia. "In every country, bar none," he wrote, "contraception has led to abortion, and once abortion, to infanticide, the prelude to full-blown euthanasia."

Recently Human Life International's President Father Shenan Boquet, <u>provided</u> <u>further insight</u> into this relationship.

"Contraception, abortion, and euthanasia are all rotten fruits of the same diseased tree," he said. "If life is unwanted in the beginning because it is inconvenient, then it makes sense that at the end of life, when a person becomes inconvenient, that we should be free to "abort" this life as well. Euthanasia would not be possible without the widespread acceptance of abortion, and the violence of abortion would not be possible without the full-throated acceptance of contraception."

We as a nation stand on very precarious ground.

There is much work to be done. It is our task to remain strong, standing with courage, and with our feet firmly grounded in truth.

"Be strong and of good courage, do not fear or be in dread of them: for it is the Lord your God who goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you... do not fear or be dismayed." (Deuteronomy 31 6,8).

The victory is Christ's. The culture of life will win out over the culture of death, of this, we can be certain.
