Newsletter No 01: 7th February 2021 5th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus the Humble Saviour (Mark 1:29 - 39)

In the Gospel today, Mark describes a typical day in the life of Jesus in his public ministry. It is like looking at a whirlwind - Jesus comes in breathless action - announcing the Kingdom of his Father by word and deed, and driving out the power of Satan and

Jesus has just been teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum, where he demonstrated his power and the authority of his word – even driving an unclean spirit out of a man possessed.

Now he goes to the house of Simon and Andrew where they tell him of Simon's mother-in-law who is ill with a fever. Jesus goes to her, takes her by the hand and raises her up (it is the same word in Greek as is used for Jesus rising from the dead). She then waits on them - showing how completely she is healed.

'That evening at sunset, they brought to Jesus all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons.

What we see is Jesus the Saviour at work: he is proclaiming by word and action that God's Kingdom has come near and that the kingdom of Satan is being cast out. We see Jesus arising early in the morning to commune with his Father in prayer.

Jesus will inaugurate the Kingdom of God by his painful and sorrowful Death on the Cross, and by his Resurrection from the dead.

By our faith and baptism, we become part of the Kingdom that is shown in a visible way through the Church. We each have been saved and 'raised up' by our contact with Him. We too are to be missionaries of the kingdom, inviting others to become disciples of Jesus and by our love and compassion announcing his kingship. Let us take the opportunity at the Eucharist today to renew our love for Him and our repudiation of sin and the works of darkness.

May Christ and his Presence – live in our hearts through our faith and love for Him! May He also live in our homes and in our neighbourhood. We carry his Presence into our homes and our neighbourhoods.

In the first reading Job points out the emptiness of life without Christ. With Christ we can do all things, because He is our Hope, our Joy and our Peace.

Pope's prayer intention for February:

For women who are victims of violence



Pope Francis' prayer intention for the month of February sends a powerful message against the various kinds of violence against women, which he describes as the "degradation of all humanity".

The Pope Video for February has been published, with the prayer intention that Francis is entrusting to the entire Catholic Church through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network. It is a powerful message against the violence that millions of women suffer daily: "psychological violence, verbal violence, physical violence, sexual violence." For Pope Francis, these abuses are "acts of cowardice and a degradation of all humanity." Consequently, he asks us to pray for the victims, "that they may be protected by society and have their sufferings considered and heeded by all."

This month's <u>Pope Video</u> seeks to make the drama of this issue visible also through narration with images. Thanks to the collaboration of <u>Hermes Mangialardo</u>—an Italian creative who has won international prizes and is a professor of animation design—the video represents, through animated illustrations, the story of a woman who is the victim of violence, who finds courage to escape from the tunnel of abuse thanks to her own strength and to the help of the community.

Violence against women, in numbers

"It's shocking how many women are beaten, insulted, and raped," says the Holy Father in The Pope Video. Indeed, the statistics compiled by UN Women, updated in November of 2020, are stunning: each day, 137 women are killed by members of their own family; adult women make up nearly half of the victims of human trafficking identified worldwide; and globally, one in three women have experienced physical or sexual violence at some point (and 15 million adolescent girls worldwide aged 15 to 19 have experienced forced sexual relations). What's more, last year there was the aggravating factor of the pandemic: the restriction of movement, social isolation and economic insecurity made women globally even more vulnerable to violence in private environments.

In his February message, the Pope asks for society to protect these victims. Although at least 155 countries have approved domestic violence laws and 140 have legislation regarding workplace sexual harassment, to give two examples, this does not mean that these laws always conform with international norms and recommendations, nor that they are applied and enforced.

Kia tau te rangimarie kia koutou

E hoa mā, New Year greetings and blessings to you all. My last newsletter to you was on 17 December 2020. I began that newsletter by saying "There is no doubt that 2020 will go down as a difficult year," and then went on to speak of the challenges of Covid-19. I am not sure what this year is going to be, what challenges there will be, what will happen in the Church and around the world. Whatever hap-pens, there will be blessings.

On the 2 January I was able to share with you the news that Bishop Paul Martin SM has been appoint-ed by Pope Francis as the Coadjutor Archbishop of Wellington. That is a great blessing. While serving as Coadjutor Archbishop of Wellington, Archbishop Paul will also act as the Administrator of the Diocese of Christchurch. He and I will be having discussions tomorrow to finalise plans for his coming to Wellington and how we will share responsibilities. I will also share with you as soon as possible a date for a liturgical reception for Archbishop Paul. I extend a very warm welcome to him.

On 8 December last year Pope Francis issued a letter on St Joseph called *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart") in which he declared a "Year of St Joseph". That is a blessing for all of us. The Pope reminds us that special prayers are offered to St Joseph every Wednesday. I suggest to all parishes that when possible (when it is not another Feastday) that Masses on Wednesdays should be celebrated as a Votive Mass of St Joseph. That will be a blessing for us.

On 15 January Pope Francis issued a Motu Proprio *Spiritus Domini* in which he modifies Canon 230 § 1 regarding the access of women to the ministries of Lector and Acolyte. Some people may think that this is not a big deal, but in actual fact it is highly symbolic and should be seen as a very welcome development in liturgical ministries. *Spiritus Domini* is the latest movement in a long-term process to enable the whole People of God to have ownership of the liturgy, to take part in the liturgy as their vocation and to see themselves as ministers with the Church. This too is a great blessing because it enables us to see that these ministries are now mandated in canon law.

There will continue to be challenges and difficulties this year. The on-going threat of the spread of Covid-19 is still there, but there are blessings in that too as we saw last year when people went out of their way to assist others, to put others first. We will need to keep doing that, Covid-19 or not; that is what our lives as Catholics is all about. As the Church's Catechism reminds us "every baptised person is called to be a blessing and to bless." CCC 1669

With abundant blessings for the year ahead.
