Dear sisters and brothers in the Marlborough Parish,

As provincial of the Passionist Congregation to which Fr Pat and Fr Jacob belong, it has been a very welcome occasion to have been able to return to the parish for Fr Pat's farewell. My last visit was in February 2020, before COVID made such dramatic changes to all our lives. Not being able to visit our religious in the four different countries of the Province, and not being able to share in the life of their parishes, has been a great trial. After many years in Papua New Guinea, China and Australia, he was so happy to be 'home' again. He came to enjoy being semi -retired after his second long appointment in PNG. He was not expecting to take up the responsibilities of being the Parish Priest. He often spoke of how much he depended on your support and prayers during the big challenges you all faced, especially through the reconfiguration of the parish and the death of Fr. John Pearce.

At the Pentecost mass, I was able to thank Fr Pat personally for his constant, selfless and humble ministry among you. I repeat here in the Newsletter, that thanks I expressed on Sunday to you the parishioners for your care for Fr. Pat. I thank you also for your patience during this long period of uncertainty, waiting for Fr Giltus to arrive. Fr Giltus is longing to come. We are all waiting for the New Zealand government to grant him a 'Religious Worker" visa that would allow him to come to the parish. I am especially grateful to His Eminence, Cardinal John Dew, for his support also.
