## Newsletter 32 19 September 2021 25th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Tēnā koutou, tēnā koutou, tēnā koutou katoa. Nga mihi nui ki a koutou katoa.

This week Aotearoa New Zealand observes te reo Māori language week and social justice week. The theme for social Justice week 2021 is "encounter and community". The volatile time of change and uncertainty could draw us into our shells. The impact of the pandemic, our reliance on technology, a growing culture of individualism, fear of anything/anyone different and instant gratification are a few reasons why people withdraw into themselves. But Pope Francis reminds us that "isolation and withdrawal into one's interests are never the way to restore hope and bring about renewal. Rather it is closeness; it is the culture of encounter". (Fratelli Tutti, #30.)

Today the ability to sit down with others and really listen to them is becoming an lost art amid virtual networks and the narcissism prevalent in what passes for communication today. Pope Francis refers to it as "information without wisdom" (Fratelli Tutti, #47). We are invited to acknowledge the richness and dignity of each culture and individual that can become a point for an encounter. Love can overcome all fear and provide us with a sound basis for a culture of encounter. Love is the ultimate spiritual measure of a person's life. As Christians, we need "to recognise that love takes first place; love must never be put at risk, and the greatest danger lies in failing to love." (1 Cor 13:1-13 and Fratelli Tutti, #92.) We are called to be God's hands and feet, and this requires encountering others and sharing God's transcending and transforming love – bringing the Church to life!

### The Star of the Sea Parish Review

**Group (RG)** meeting was held on Tuesday 10th August 2021.The RG is made up of all Members of the SOTS Finance and Property Committee and the SOTS Parish Pastoral Council. The RG is co-chaired by Tom Harrison and Greg Stretch and meets bi-monthly on the second Tuesday.

The responsibility of the Review Group is to complete a review of their churches and presbyteries as directed by Cardinal John Dew, which was an outcome of the 2017 Archdiocesan Synod. This process started in February 2019.

A summary of the meeting held on the 10th August follows:

The RG is to commence consultation with local Iwi's regarding the sale of any land owned by the Catholic Church in Marlborough.

As in our recommendation to Cardinal John, no work is required on our buildings in Kaikoura, while we continue to work through options for the vacant sections in Ward and Seddon. As previously advised, an Earthguake Prone Building Notice (EPB) was placed on St Marys Church in Blenheim, due to its low NBS rating. The Parish has until July 2036 to carry out building work to ensure the building is no longer earthquake-prone and complete the necessary seismic work. Regular Masses have ceased at Sacred Heart Church in Havelock and St Francis de Sales Church in Renwick, A final mass was held at Havelock presided by Monsignor Gerry Burns followed by a luncheon which was well attended by existing and former parishioners. A final mass will be held at St Francis de Sales later.

Work has commenced in removing a wall at St Joseph School in Picton, this will provide a better layout for our community when having mass in Picton.

Our Parish Priest, Father Giltus, while based in Sydney, is heavily involved in the RG, and provides sounds advise and contributions during our discussions.

The RG while acknowledging the scale of the review and the time it's taken so far; are happy with the progress we are making. We would like to thank the Parishioners of Star of the Sea Parish for their ongoing support during this process.
