Newsletter 42—28th November 2021 1st Sunday of Advent

This week we begin the season of Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year. The Advent liturgy is shot through with a great longing for Christ. Waiting is one of the hardest things for us. We live in an instant age — instant food, instant this, that and the other. We even speed up nature: with artificial light we fool the hens to lay two eggs a day! We are in too much of a hurry in having every possible experience too early in life. The speed of our world today is full of contradictions. We rush to save time in order to be able to waste it! But Advent is a four-week course on waiting.

The pandemic has in a way forcefully put a break into otherwise our busy lives. We face the same fears, same uncertainties, same insecurities and we long and hope for an answer. Our lives have been changed. The course of history has sifted, whose significance we still have to understand. Now it may not be a time to make a New Year resolution but maybe it is time to take a look at life differently, what we value most? We began the pandemic with a spirit of cooperation and a willingness to work together but unfortunately this is wearing thin. We are beginning to express our fears in ways sadly, not very encouraging or healthy.

Maybe it is time to listen more deeply, wait patiently to welcome one another, to celebrate our differences rather than hate. I take the comfort in knowing that 'God writes straight with crooked lines,' God can somehow take the messes we make out of our life and turn them in to moment of grace and new beginnings. We have been surrounded by uncertainty and fear that has helped us to imagine some of the worst things. May be somehow our waiting during this advent season becomes an opportunity for God to write straight with crooked lines once again in our lives.

The most important things in life cannot be rushed and require patient waiting. Patient waiting is required from the mother to bring the child to birth, and then from babyhood to adulthood; the teacher requires it with the slow learner; the politician requires it not to give up on the peace process, and everybody requires it to build loving relationships. We wait not mournfully, but in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ. Giltus Mathias CP

Apple—Adam and Eve made a promise to obey God, but when they broke their promise they had to leave the beautiful garden.

Scripture: Genesis 3

Noah's Ark—Noah built an ark to save his family and animals from a huge flood.

Scripture: Genesis 6:11-14; 7:17-8:3; 9:8-13

Abraham looking at stars—

Abraham was obedient to God and God told Abraham that his descendants would be as many as the stars in heaven. **Scripture:** Genesis 15:1-6

Rams' head—God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac and Abraham was prepared to obey, but then God provides a ram as a sacrifice.
