Newsletter 11, 6th April2025 5th Sunday of Lent

Jesus is so very clever in turning what could be difficult questions into wonderful teachings and in today's reading we hear that once again the Scribes and Pharisees are setting a trap for Jesus with a difficult question this time about the woman caught in adultery. If Jesus pardoned the woman, he could be accused of encouraging people to break the law of Moses. However, if he agreed she should be stoned, he would lose his name for showing mercy. There is no more judgemental and condemnatory person than the self righteous. But there is more than adultery to talk about here. There is also the horrible way the scribes and Pharisees treated the woman. They exposed her to humiliating public shaming. They showed not the slightest regard for her feelings. She was just someone who could be used to entrap Jesus as they pursued their aim to get rid of Him.

What a difference then, between the way the Pharisees treated the woman and the way Jesus did. Jesus didn't condemn her, but he did condemned her sin. It's not that the sin didn't matter to him, it did. But he distinguished between the sin and the sinner. He corrected her, but so gently. And despite the way the Scribes and Pharisees behaved, Jesus dealt with *them* in a marvellously gentle and subtle way. He didn't condemn them, he didn't judge them. He invited them to judge themselves.

The story warns us about being too quick to take the moral high ground, for which of us is without sin? It's easy to condemn others, to talk about others faults and misdemeanours; the very act of condemning another involves a sin. There is surely a time to correct another; but there is an art in doing so. It consists of being totally kind and totally honest. We must be willing to extend to others the same compassion we would like to receive if we were in the same situation. For there is no more important thing in life than to show compassion for a fellow human being. The mission of the Church is to be a place of forgiveness so that those who fail - as we all do at some times - may experience the love and compassion of the One who refused to condemn. The Church ought to be a community of grace, a community free from condemnation, a community which will not condemn but which will love.
