Father, Son, Holy Spirit. Today we celebrate the Trinity. When I was little, the nuns who taught me, used the clover leaf to explain the Trinity, three leaflets on one stem making a whole leaf; or the triangle with three edges (straight sides) and three vertices (corners) making up a whole triangle. We can acknowledge that we might not understand this Trinity. Three Persons, one God; it makes little sense. But does it need to make sense? We know this Parent who loves us all, who created the earth and everything in it – for us. We know Jesus who came to dwell among us, who performed miracles, who was crucified and then rose from the dead – for us. We know the Holy Spirit who enlightens our hearts and minds, who inspires and astounds us. The sign of the Cross we make every day is an acknowledgement of the Trinity. Understanding is not essential and is in fact impossible. It is the belief in the Trinity and the inspiration the belief can make in our lives that is crucial for without the belief we have nothing. The love of the Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit is poured out on all creation.

And this creation that we have been given by God is ours to care for, and then to pass on to the next generation in as good a state - or better than - we received it. Is that what we are doing with our world, treating it as well as we can? $m \ddot{O}r$ are we taking God's great goodness for granted and not caring how we treat our natural world. Friday, June 20th marks Matariki, the Maori New Year. A time when we rejoice in God's creation; a time to remember our history and roots; a time of growth and change; a time to celebrate what we have and what gifts we have to use. Matariki is a celebration of culture, language, spirit and people. We celebrate the gift from God of this planet Earth, while we give thanks for Matariki, season of new beginnings and guiet growth.
